## "THE FAMILY" AND PARAGRAPHS 10–13 IN THE 2030 AGENDA

Paragraphs 10 and 11 in the 2030 Agenda (page 576 of the Negotiating Guide) remind us of previous international commitments, and that it is the total of these previously adopted principles and commitments that will be used to implement the 2030 Agenda – that they are "linked to each other and are interdependent" (paragraph 13).

In paragraph 10 it says the 2030 Agenda is "grounded in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and international human rights treaties." That would include:

Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Article 16-3:

"The family is the natural and fundamental group unit of society and is entitled to protection by society and the State."

International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, Article 10-1:

"The widest possible protection and assistance should be accorded to the family, which is the natural and fundamental group unit of society,"

International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, Article 23-1:

"The family is the natural and fundamental group unit of society and is entitled to protection by society and the State."

Convention on the Rights of the Child, Preamble (sixth paragraph):

"Convinced that the family, as the fundamental group of society and the natural environment for the growth and well-being of all its members and particularly children, should be afforded the necessary protection and assistance so that it can fully assume its responsibilities within the community."

In paragraph 11 of the 2030 Agenda it reaffirms the outcomes of all major United Nations conferences and summits, including the World Summit for Social Development, the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development, the Beijing Platform for Action. These documents include:

World Summit for Social Development, 80:

"The family is the basic unit of society and as such should be strengthened. It is entitled to receive comprehensive protection and support."

Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development, Principle 9: "The family is the basic unit of society and as such should be strengthened. It is entitled to receive comprehensive protection and support."

Beijing Platform for Action, 29:

"The family is the basic unit of society and as such should be strengthened. It is entitled to receive comprehensive protection and support."

Paragraph 11 continues to say, "We also reaffirm the follow-up to these conferences," which would include:

Social Summit +5, 25:

"There has been continued recognition that the family is the basic unit of society and that it plays a key role in social development and is a strong force of social cohesion and integration."

Beijing +5, 60:

"The family is the basic unit of society and is a strong force for social cohesion and integration and as such should be strengthened."
